

DEAR SUPPORTERS OF PRIMAVERA,


have been a member of the board of Primavera helping children in need e.V. for two years.

FROM AN IDEA TO HELPING THOUSANDS OF CHILDREN

n 1990, the Bosch Zünder editor Marianne Waas-Frey travelled to the Bosch locations in Brazil for a report she was working on. While she was meant to be reporting on Bosch business, she was shocked by the misery of the children in the slums of Campinas, and the images kept haunting her after her return to Germany. As her daughter Eva-Maria Waas remembers: "When my mother came home at the end of her three-week trip across Brazil, there was only one thing on her mind: ,Eva, we have to do something." She talked about the huge favelas, the helpless mothers with their children, and the unbelievable poverty on the outskirts of the big cities. She also mentioned the Bosch associates who had started to help with small projects on the ground. "They urgently need our help," said Marianne Waas-Frey. She also told her colleagues about her experience and got them interested in her project. Soon, the idea of a call for donations was born. This marked the beginning of Primavera.

The first projects in Brazil, India, and Mexico were supported as early as mid-1991. Other countries soon followed. Since then, Primavera aid has benefited many thousands of young people, mainly in Asia, South America, South Africa and, since 2013, in Eastern Europe. Children and young people are primarily supported with their education up to high school and university graduation. Vocational training projects for young adults are also included. Facilities for people with disabilities, medical care facilities, and pro-

jects for street children also receive support. In addition to a wide range of educational opportunities, the children and their families are taught about hygiene, healthy eating, social behavior, and how to treat each other responsibly. The overall aim is to give disadvantaged young people the chance to find their place in society later on and lead self-determined and independent lives. The basic prerequisite for supporting projects is that all Primavera collaborations with social partners are supported and promoted locally and that all projects are located close to Bosch locations, where they are supported and monitored by Bosch associates working on a voluntary basis. Everyone involved – from the Board of Management to the many helpers and other supporters – is a volunteer. This means that 100 percent of all donations go to the projects.

"Isn't it great what my little idea has become?" Marianne Waas-Frey once rightly asked. Primavera emerged from a simple call for donations. Today, the initiative counts more than 1,650 current and former Bosch associates among its members. Together, they support more than 11,000 children and young people about 20 countries, giving them a chance for a good future. To date, Primavera has collected and distributed some 15 million euros in donations and income.

Many thanks to the countless donors and helpers who have made Primavera possible, have accompanied us for 35 years, and will hopefully continue to do so!









THE HEART AND SOUL OF PRIMAVERA SPECIAL HONOR FOR ROLAND MÜLLER-FIEDLER

t hurts when children suffer. By working at Primavera, we can counteract this to some extent." Since he first joined Primavera, this statement has always guided Roland Müller-Fiedler's commitment.

he annual general meeting of Primavera e.V. took place on March 17, 2025 at Schillerhöhe and offered members the opportunity to look back on the association's work over the past year and look ahead to future projects. The meeting was opened by Stefan Grosch, chairman of the Board of Primavera. The welcome address was also marked by Primavera's 35th anniversary, which is being celebrated this year. Deputy chairman Christoph Kübel paid tribute to this in a brief review of the origins and development of the association. The presentation of the financial report by treasurer Sebastian Krieger was followed by the auditors' report. Another important item on the agenda was the discharge of the auditors and the Board of Directors, which was approved

unanimously. This shows the members' confidence in the work performed and the strategic direction of the association.

The meeting also provided an exciting outlook on planned projects and events for the coming year. As of **March 2025**, funding is planned for some 45 projects in 20 countries.

An important conclusion on this evening: Last but not least, a lively exchange with the members and their active participation are crucial for the success of the association. All supporters of Primavera are therefore cordially invited to continue to get involved and work together on the future of the aid organization.

NEW FILTER SYSTEMS FOR THE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL IN KIEV

he Okhmatdyt children's hospital in Kiev, the largest pediatric facility in Ukraine, treats thousands of children from all over the country each year. Among other things, the doctors there perform extremely difficult operations to save the young patients' lives.

As already reported in the Primavera Newsletter 2/2024, the hospital building was severely damaged by a missile attack in the summer of 2024, meaning that the children's treatment could not continue. As a result of the massive destruction, the radiators and heat transfer units no longer worked, and the ventilation system had to be used as a makeshift solution to heat the rooms. However, old filters clogged with dirt and dust prevented effective operation. Without replacing them, it was impossible to ensure sterile operating theatres and intensive care units, or to maintain the correct temperature in the hospital.

Primavera made a generous donation to finance the purchase of new ventilation filters for the hospital so that the children's medical treatment could be resumed as quickly as possible. Bosch in Ukraine and the non-profit organization Tabletochki Charitable Foundation, which helps children with oncological and hematological illness, participated in the project and took over coordination and the installation of the devices.

The ongoing Russian attacks are increasingly traumatizing the population in Ukraine, and this deeply affects us all. We have therefore decided to make a further donation of 50,000 euros and are once again asking for your support. With your commitment, you are making a significant contribution to the faster reconstruction of the children's hospital and the procurement of vital medical equipment. BOOSTING SELF-CONFIDENCE WITH MUSIC

Sorocaba /



Primavera recently began supporting the "Encanto" project of the Pastoral do Menor organization with donations. The project takes place in nine districts in Sorocaba, Brazil, a city in the federal state of Sao Paolo. It benefits around 1,100 children and young people by giving them access to art, musical education, creativity, self-expression, and communication skills. The initiative



takes the form of itinerant workshops in the community education centers of the Pastoral do Menor in Sorocaba. The workshops focus on music education and the development of emotional intelligence.

The main aim of the project is to introduce children and young people from socially disadvantaged backgrounds to art and culture. As a result of their difficult environment, they often have limited access to these types of learning opportunities. At the same time, Pastoral aims to give them the tools they need to recognize and effectively express their emotions. This can be done through music lessons, for example. The project is run by a team of art teachers who have increased their workload to ensure that music lessons can take place once a week in each neighborhood. Beyond musical education, weekly personality development and self-confidence workshops are also offered for the children in all participating neighborhoods.

LESSONS FOR STREET CHILDREN IN JAKARTA



Jakarta

ahabat Anak is a child protection organization that supports socially disadvantaged children in Jakarta, the capital of Indonesia. The children mainly live on the streets and often have to contribute to earning income for their families. They are always on the lookout for work, a place to sleep, and food. On the street, they are exposed to violence, crime, prostitution, drug use, and sexual abuse.

Sahabat Anak gives these children access to education in addition to providing food and health checks. Since 2004, the organization has held regular tutoring sessions in six districts of Jakarta. The organization also runs two nonformal schools for children who have dropped out of state school, which Primavera has been supporting donations since 2024. So far, 74 children have been able to participate in the program and 12 of them have received a scholarship for an education. In addition, Sahabat Anak has two early childhood education schools in Grogol and Cijantung, which are also supported by Primavera.

Bosch associates in Indonesia monitor the progress of the project on site and act as volunteers.



A STORY ABOUT GENEROSITY AND A WILLINGNESS TO HELP

hen Esethu came to Johannesburg from the countryside, she was looking for a better life. But the transition was anything but easy. She was a shy, insecure girl who lacked self-confidence and didn't know what the future would bring.

Her life changed when she became a student at Canaan Preschool, a place that offered her not only education but also healing. Under the loving care of Londiwe, the school's principal, and her dedicated teachers, Esethu found a safe haven where she could grow, learn and regain her self-confidence.

One of the moments she was most looking forward to was the arrival of the vehicle with food parcels from "Operation Antifreeze", a project that is also supported by Primavera. Over 500 children in eleven schools close to the Bosch-Rexroth site in the greater Pretoria area receive nutritious foods such as maize flour, rice, pasta, sugar, and

cookies. For Esethu and the other children, the arrival of the vehicle meant more than just food – it meant safety and joy. The food parcels they received were a lifeline and ensured that their families had something to eat in the evenings and at weekends.

What Esethu didn't know at the time was that these meals, the precious food parcels, and even the occasional treats in the form of potato chips or chocolate were made possible by the generosity of Primavera. Their support meant full stomachs, bright smiles, and the opportunity for children like Esethu to focus on learning rather than hunger.

Today, Esethu is a confident young woman and her life journey is a powerful example of what helpfulness and generosity can achieve. Thanks to donors like Primavera, her story is one of hope and unlimited possibilities.

Sometimes it's the first step that takes life in a new direction. My journey began in 2012 during my training as an organizational assistant at Bosch. A stay in Brazil provided me with new perspectives and had a lasting impact on my life. In Curitiba, I visited a kindergarten that is supported by Primavera. The children, who came from a favela, were beaming – not only when they were playing and learning, but also at lunch, which was the only regular meal of the day for many of them.

When I looked into the children's sparkling eyes, I knew that this work is something very special – and I really wanted to be a part of it! Primavera gives them a chance for a better future, which is not a given in their environment. This experience touched me deeply and filled me with hope and gratitude. I immediately decided to become a member of Primavera and part of this wonderful movement

Another memorable experience was my visit to El Salam School in Cairo, a school in a poor district that is referred to as the "garbage city". During my time there, I experienced once again how valuable Primavera's work is for the children. The conditions in this neighborhood were appalling, but the children being taught there radiated an incredible joy. Both the education and healthcare that Primavera provided gave these children a perspective. Knowing that this school could not exist without Primavera's support moved me deeply. In a country like Egypt, especially in such disadvantaged neighborhoods, such a facility is not a matter of course.

I have been volunteering with Primavera since 2017, alongside my role as assistant to the board of management. In this role, I have the privilege of supporting both Stefan Grosch, the current Chairman of the Board, and Christoph Kübel, who previously held the position, in all matters relating to Primavera. My tasks include organizing the general meetings and supporting projects, particularly in India, Nepal, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka. My work "behind the scenes" has evolved over the years. For



example, I have taken on the planning and design of Primavera's LinkedIn account. A well-maintained social media presence is crucial for reaching a wide audience, creating transparency, and generating donations. I actively maintain Primavera's LinkedIn presence to make the association's valuable work more visible and inspire more people to get involved.

Every video that reaches me and shows a child's success story moves me to tears. I am and will continue to be a fully committed silent helper in the background. It is a pleasure for me to work with Primavera to help give children around the world the opportunity to build a better future for themselves. The moments when I see the children's eyes sparkling are a wonderful gift.


